## Current

- 2.1 Any Shia Muslim adult over the age of 18 years legally residing in UK can apply for the membership of the Idaara and agrees to pay the annual membership fee and/or such other dues as may be prescribed from time to time and undertake to observe the rules and regulations of the Idaara.

  - 2.1.1 legally residing in UK can apply for the membership of the Idaara and agrees to pay the annual membership fee and/or such other dues as may be prescribed from time to time and undertake to observe the rules and regulations of the Idaara.
  - 2.1.2 must be of integral character and must not have, or have had, any previous disqualifications or restrictions imposed by the Charity Commission (whether current or past) to stand as a trustee of any charity.

# Azhar Kiani

We have received a text message from Idara texting which states that "Previously elected trustees are not eligible to stand for any position for three terms if they have resigned without valid reason during their term as per the motion passed at AGM 2019".

According to the constitutional clause, **11.3** " Motion for the amendment must be approved by a two-thirds majority of members present at AGM/EGM" whereas this motion was not approved by the required majority.

This motion is a contradiction of the constitutional clause **2.10** "A member may resign at any time by giving notice in writing to the secretary of Idara".

The said motion should be declared null and void as this is a violation of the constitution of Idara.

- 4.7.2.4 The President to serve no more than two consecutive terms **and must have a break of at least one term before contesting for the same position again.**
- 4.7.2.4 The President and the Secretary can jointly sanction the expenditure of not more than **£1000** for any one purpose.
